*Washington, DC* (January 16, 2014) — What do the controversy over fracking, desalination costs, and the growing Syrian civil war have in common? Water. Global freshwater supply affects a broad range of issues, including public health, food crises, and environmental catastrophes.

The eighth edition of *The World's Water* series, edited by **Peter Gleick**, the world's foremost expert on freshwater, shows how water touches everything. It addresses a myriad of issues including water conflict, global water governance, and water management and their effects on the economy and climate. In this highly regarded series, Gleick and his Pacific Institute colleagues have provided potential solutions to these problems as well as expert insights into freshwater issues, key water data, and more.

Additional topics covered include:

- "Zombie water projects," or expensive infrastructure proposals that are killed off and brought back to life despite social, political, environmental, or economic flaws in the plan.

Like previous volumes, in addition to full chapters the book includes *In Brief* reports, a complete table of contents and index that span all eight volumes of the series, and updated data tables regarding international conflicts over water, the Millennium Development Goals, irrigation and agriculture, water funding, and more.

Gleick and his contributors combine abundant data, insightful analysis, and conviction that better education and awareness of water issues will lead to implementing smart and effective solutions. *The World's Water Volume 8*, like its predecessors, is an invaluable resource for community leaders, health officials, academics, students, and others whose work touches on freshwater.
